distinction in the PG diploma in Education in Teaching of Foreign Languages and possesses a first class honours in B.A. in French/Spanish from the University of the West Indies.

Lee-ann is also an ICT Facilitator for the Ministry of Education of Trinidad and Tobago (MoETT) and was part of the team, which developed the UNESCO ICT programme that has been running for the last three years for Secondary School Teachers.

She has also presented several educational workshops locally, including "Motivating the 21st Century Language Learner" (three Cohorts conducted for 2018, with over 70 participants nationwide) and "Creating a Generation Z engaged classroom". Her most recent experience was a workshop at St. George's College, where she presented on "E-testing – Ready or not?" She also presented at the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD) in Chicago and American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese (AATSP) in San Diego in 2019. She has developed a Facebook page, 21st Century Educators, which aims to provide professional development online for teachers. It is thematic and research-based and

thus resources are provided for educators. The page has gained almost 8000 likes in less than 9 months and has a global following. Moreover, 21st Century Educators recently started conducting webinars, with its inaugural webinar "Transforming Teacher Mind set" in November 2019. This was open to worldwide participants and it is to be noted that we had participants who described the session as "Just what she needed at this time." She has also created a new teacher orientation programme for Bishop Anstey High School East and Trinity College East (BATCE), known as CIMP (Comprehensive Induction and Mentoring Programme). The Comprehensive Induction and Mentoring Programme (CIMP) has been designed to support the growth and professional development of new teachers at BATCE. It provides a full year of professional support so that new teachers can develop the requisite skills and knowledge that will enable them to achieve success as experienced teachers at the institution. By helping new teachers achieve their full potential, the CIMP supports BATCE's vision of achieving high levels of student performance.

She also was part of a team, which put together a 3-day professional development conference at BATCE that catered for over 140 teachers and administrators with a range of topics such as health and mental wellness, ICT in education, Assessment and Evaluation and Leadership in Education among others. Additionally, Leeann is the official ambassador for Genial.ly for the Caribbean.

Lee-ann is passionate about education and would like to see the education system evolve in preparing students for the 21st century. She is creative and likes to try new things within the classroom. She is also a problem-solver and seeks to find a research-based solution rather than dwell on the problem.

To be effective, professional development must provide teachers with a way to directly apply what they learn to their teaching (AERJ Research Points, 2005). That is the goal of these workshops.

Led by an experienced and dedicated teacher and instructional coach, our workshops are based on the latest research. These focused learning experiences are crafted to deepen teacher and administrator understanding of a specific topic or instructional strategy and provide tools to take back immediately to their classrooms and schools. We have already conducted workshops in "Motivating the 21st century Language Learner" as well as stage one of the orientation programme for new teachers at Bishop Anstey High School East and Trinity College East. Additionally, we have conducted the workshop "Creating a Generation Z engaged classroom," and "E-testing – Ready or not." We also work alongside a team of experts who can conduct professional development workshops in a myriad of fields aimed to produce the best in educators.

Current Professional Development Workshops/Webinars

1. Creating engaging remote classes using Google classroom

THE PROGRAMME/OBJECTIVES

This 3-day 9-hour online workshop intends to develop teachers in creating e-lessons using the Google classroom platform. This session helps teachers set up their classroom as well as provides practical examples and sample resources to create engaging e-lessons. This session best suits groups of no more than 10 - 15 persons at a time to maximise creation of classrooms.

The objectives will be:

Day 1:

- Getting started with Google classroom
- Engaging students in an Asynchronous environment with virtual, interactive classrooms

Day 2:

- Engaging students in an Asynchronous environment through games and Project-based learning
- Engaging students in a synchronous environment Focus on Zoom/Google meets

Day 3:

- Assessing students in a remote setting
- Movement in a remote classroom

2. Creating a Generation Z Engaged Classroom

THE PROGRAMME/OBJECTIVES

This workshop intends to develop secondary school teachers in Trinidad and Tobago. This session explores exciting ways to maximise their strengths and motivate them in your classroom such as game-based and project-based learning. Participants will explore the learning characteristics and preferences for classroom engagement of Generation Z students and how these are different than those of previous generations. They will actively participate in the session and leave with ready to use resources for their classroom.

The focus will be on:

• Characteristics of Generation Z

- Strategies to maximise the strengths and motivate of Generation Z
- Hands-on and ready-to-use strategies for the classroom

2. Motivating the 21St Century Language Learner in Trinidad and Tobago THE PROGRAMME/OBJECTIVES

This workshop intends to develop Language teachers in Trinidad and Tobago. Teachers will develop instructional skills in order to motivate students to voluntarily pursue Languages. Teachers will learn a variety of strategies, including assessment and game-based learning to ensure that teaching remains student-centered and applicable to the 21st Century Learner. All participants will also be engaged in hands-on activities which will allow them to practice the theories learnt.

- Motivation through assessment in the modern language classroom
- Motivating students by using online and offline tools in the classroom

7. New Teacher Orientation Programme

It intends to acculturise the teacher to the Ministry of Education's standards and encourage voluntary professional development. The programme will allow for reflective practice so that teachers can evaluate their own growth and tailor instruction for their students.

The programme includes a 3-4 day Orientation conference, 10 one-day monthly workshops and an optional mentorship-training programme.
