FINE AROMAS PERUVIAN COFFEE GROWERS COOPERATIVE

In 2021, 32 producers founded the Fine Aromas Peruvian Coffee Growers Cooperative with the purpose of continuing to cultivate varieties renowned for their fine aromas and unique flavors, and to mitigate the low prices paid for our coffee due to limited negotiation with buyers.

The cooperative currently comprises 227 members, of which 154 are male and 73 are female, distributed across the provinces of Jaén, San Ignacio, Cutervo, Utcubamba, and Rioja. It is engaged in the marketing of both organic and conventional coffee for export as well as the domestic market, handling the collection and exportation of coffee from our members.

Through the Agricultural Area, the cooperative provides technical assistance and training to the producers, aiming to promote the proper implementation of activities in the production, harvesting, and post-harvest processes of the product. This includes agronomic managment of coffee plantations, selective harvesting, pulping, and drying.

As an organization, we offer an exclusive package for our members that sets us apart. Our methodology of Field Schools (FS) focuses on providing training with a practical and participatory approach. We firmly believe in the principle of learning by doing: while 25% of learning is acquired through observation and listening, the remaining 75% comes from direct and active experience in workshops and practical activities.
