### *CAL English Proficiency Test for Teachers (CAL EPT Teachers)*

The CAL EPT Teachers measures the English language proficiency of nonnative English-speaking teachers in four skills (reading, writing, speaking, and listening). An informative score report summarizes the examinee's skills according to CEFR proficiency levels and provides further information to meet employment certification, funding, and reporting requirements.

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### *CAL English Proficiency Test for Students: 4 Skills (CAL EPT Students: 4 Skills)*

The *CAL EPT Students: 4 Skills* is a suite of assessments with two tests – one test may be used with students in the upper years of primary education and one test may be used with students in the lower years of secondary education. The assessments are designed to measure the English proficiency of students of English in Latin America in order to provide information to administrators, educators, families, and students about students' growing English language proficiency.
