Recent achievements

In 2017, we catalyzed comprehensive development in the 4th most impoverished municipality in Mexico.

We work in **Metlatonoc**, one of the communities with the **highest rates of poverty worldwide**, which is located in the mountains of Guerrero. From 2015-2017, together with the government program Prospera, we promoted **community transformation**, starting with the most basic needs like personal hygiene and sanitation.

After three years, community members have made changes in caring for their health, nutrition, gender equality, co-existence and have reflected on their traditional norms, proposing such groundbreaking changes as ending the sale of girls and women, in forced marriages. Today, Metlatonoc is a different community that will continue to progress through empowerment and newly acquired skills.

Much remains to be done in the region. Today, we are working in the neighboring municipality of Cochoapa.

We catalyze youth entrepreneurs and agents of change

This program, supported by the Inter-American Development Bank, is part of the regional Youth Entrepreneurship Program. Through formative workshops, technical advising and a mentorship program, youth successfully develop their ideas, create or strengthen their businesses and, above all, maintain them, as well as create employment in the community.

In two years, the program has been consolidated and results are seen with youth who live in marginalized communities. The program has enabled changes and improved lives.

In two years, 1000 youth have completed 101 hours of training, starting or strengthening 600 businesses in Jalisco, Hidalgo and Mexico states.


